Stuntman Killed in Set Smas

A Hollywood stuntman was killed yesterday when he was thrown from a horse he was riding for a movie scene. Ed Crasher, 42, was standing in for star Buster Chaplin, when the horse was distracted by shouts from onlookers and reared on his hind legs, throwing the man from its back. Crasher was half of famous stunt duo The

Crash Bros. with his brother Harley, who is said to have witnessed the horrific incident. We caught up with Harley for comment, who said: "I got nothin' to say, except these stars are too big for their boots and need to learn when to shut the hell up". It is unclear which "star" he was referring to.
